Some of the 18 known survivors told of being attacked by sharks as hundreds of passengers struggled for places on the two available liferafts. The vessel, the Dumaguete, had a rated capacity of only 18) persons, and apparently sprang

The vessel sank in a narrow strait of the Sulu Sea about miles wide, 15 miles east of the city of Zamboanga where President Ferdinand E. Marcos was visiting. He left for Manila, 519 miles to the north before news of the tragedy broke.
