Robert Taylor was never comfortable with his Tyronne Power played the dashing figure both on and off the screen. Errol Flynn's rakish personality was indistinguishable from his film roles. Even Clark Gable, although he snorted at being termed the King,

maintained an almost regal bearing in public. Bob Taylor was different. Perhaps the most handsome of all leading men in the 1930s and 1940s, he seemed ill at ease in his role as movie star. He never acquired that veneer of sophistication of other small-town boys who achieved stardom.

Cigarette Smoker Taylor is being buried today at Forest Lawn Memorial Park.
