Beth Eden, Lutherans Win Church Loop Games

Wade Dockery led Beth Eden past Christ Church, 28-21, in the opening game of the 1970 Church Basketball League double-header played at the B. F. Brown Junior High School gymnasium. Messiah Lutheran rode the scoring of Dennis Hill to narrowly top the Elm St. quintet in the second contest of the evening, 30-23.

Beth Eden picked up a two-point lead in a slow first quarter, 5-3, stretching it to three points at the half, 13-10.
