Priest Is 'Santa' for 2,000

"You know what? I'll say it real slow. It's time for me to say my Christmas hello. The holiday season will soon be here, and I need help with Santa and his deer." That's one of the verses from the annual Christmas letter penned by the Rev. Cormac A. Walsh, Catholic chaplain at Clinton Correctional Facility at Dannemora.

The self-styled "Old Friar from Dannemora" is confronted each year with the task of playing Santa Claus to 2,000 parishioners who can't do anything to give themselves a decent Christmas.

His parishioners are prison inmates. He has no money to purchase presents for them save the donations he receives annually from many generous Northern, Central and Southern New Yorkers. With those funds he buys "goodies, smokes, candies and all," for the inmates, "So that on Christmas -- we have a ball."

Many of the prisoners don't get a card or letter from one year's end to the next. Christmas cards? They never get any and few of their relatives think of them during the holiday season or send them a gift. So it is up to Father Walsh.

Somehow, during all the years he and his predecessors have been at Dannemora, they have always managed to get enough money--through gifts from those on the outside -- to provide each prisoner with a gift on Christmas Day.

Clinton prison, of course, is the home of the Church of St. Dismas, The Good Thief. This church was built and dedicated to The Good Thief by prisoners, and was the first inmate-built church in a state prison.

Many interesting stories come out of the prison. One involves Smokey, a prisoner who turned down parole last year so he could stay there and finish fixing the church organ which had gone on the fritz. He is a skilled organ craftsman.

He got the organ done. But then the prisoners started building a memorial shrine for Father Ambrose Hyland who built the Church of the Good Thief in 1941. Smokey got involved in that, designing and building the memorial, and when his chance for parole came up a second time he again passed it up so he could stay on and finish the memorial.

Come February, his time will be up and he will have to leave. By then he will be looking for civilian organs to repair.

Father Walsh has the arrangements made to procure what he needs to give each inmate a Christmas package this year. All he needs is the money to pay the bill and he has to depend on those who have been so generous in the past and any new helpmates that want to come aboard. Johnny Winter Performs Jan. 10 To Aid Profiles To Aid Voters

Johnny Winter, rock superstar, will give a concert featuring his unique staging and lighting Jan. 10 at the War Memorial.

He was born in Beaumont, Tex., in 1944, and started on clarinet at five or six and then went to ukelele. He was about 11 or 12 when he started to play the guitar. When he was 15, a rock band of his, Johnny and the Jammers, won a contest and the prize was an audition in Beaumont's Hall recording studio.

Winter later played in Chicago, England and at the Woodstock Festival his performance was one of the highlights. Tijuana Small featured Johnny strumming a guitar in the background of their commercials. Few who saw it will ever forget the night at Madison Square Garden when Janis Joplin surprised her audience by bringing Winter on stage to perform with her.

His brother, Edgar, has developed as a headliner, so they could alternate using their road crew, making it economically feasible for Johnny to do shorter tours. Randy Hobbs of the McCoys plays bass for Winter and Richard Hughes plays drums.

Plans for a major study of the state legislature and the men and women who serve in it have been announced by the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG). This is an organization patterned after those inspired by Ralph Nader.

NYPIRG maintains one of its three offices at 711 Comstock Ave. Others are in New York City and Albany.

Donald Ross, director of NYPIRG and former head of Nader's Citizen Action Group, announced the plans for the study of the legislature.

One of the first things to be done, he said, is to produce a set of individual profiles on every member of the Senate and Assembly.

The profiles will contain biographical data, past voting records and sources of campaign financing, Ross said.

The study is designed, Ross declared, to "begin closing the dangerous gap between the people and their elected representatives."
