

Winter also admitted that though he's never had a hit single, the "Saints and Sinners'' album has a couple of possibilities. But there's two that can probably make it. We'll probably do them in Charleston.'

When I talked with Winter by telephone that day, he was just getting ready for his New Orleans concert before taking a Christmas break: He resumed the tour the day after Christmas and

will end it Jan. 20. He admitted that concerts are hard for him to get into, but that once they begin, he's fine

"My biggest problem is to stay calm," he admitted. "I'm always nervous before I go on A couple of hours before the show, like now, I can't stand it. I pace and worry, but once I get out there and the music starts I'm okay.

'Yeah, I'm looking forward to Charleston. I don't know if many people's heard our stuff up there, but we'll try and give 'em a good show."

The show is 8 p.m. next Sunday at the Civic Center and tickets are still available, It's another of those things Terry Lowry calls. festival standing.
